What Do We Mean By Policy & Media Impact?

Demonstrating the Policy and News Media Impact of Project EAT

Prepared by the Health Sciences Libraries Policy & News Media Impact Service July 2017

Project EAT research has been referenced in 70 different policy documents from 36 governmental and non-governmental agencies worldwide. This work has been referenced in federal government documents in the United States, Argentina, Canada, France, the Netherlands, and the United Kingdom, and in local government documents in 12 states in the US and four other countries. Project EAT research has been cited in publications from on-governmental organizations including the National Bureau of Economic Research, the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development, and the National Academy of Medicine.

Project EAT research has been referenced in 128 items from oppular media channels, including newspapers and websites. The work has received attention through news outlets such as the Today Show, The Guardian, the New York Times, and Time, and through oppular websites including Wikipedia and Slate. In addition, these news items and other press releases have been distributed as syndicated news items on 69 other occasions. It is likely that this does not represent the full impact of this work as this report is limited to resources which are current yavaliable.

What impact does the research conducted at the University of Minnesota have on the wider world?

Guess what? Much of it can be measured — and the University Libraries has been assisting researchers navigate <u>impact metrics</u> for years. These metrics aim to quantify the influence of a researcher or research article. But as the metrics have been largely focused on citation counts in academic research papers, they don't clearly show the ways that university research impacts the world beyond the academic realm.

A new service at Libraries, however, is widening the scope of impact metrics available to researchers and helps them see a more complete view of the impact of their work.

"If practitioners are trying to change health behaviors and if other practitioners are reading their work and applying it; they might not necessarily turn around and publish an article on it," says <u>Caitlin Bakker</u>, a Research Services Liaison at the Bio-Medical Library. "But health is changing as a result of that activity, so how can we represent that?"





A report released Wednesday reveals Minnesota to be a paradox in rural obstetric care. No state has had more hospitals stop delivering babies in the past decade. And vet. Minnesota still has a higher rate of rural hospitals providing obstetrics (OB) per women of childbearing age than almost any other state, according to research by the Chartis Center for Rural Health in Massachusetts.






